D.S.R. & M.³ LTD. is a Company Limited by Guarantee, which means that it has a "NON-PROFIT" principle, all donations and future fares will be poured back into the development and maintenance of the Railway and Museum. **Donations are Tax Deductible.** The Museum is devoted to the authentic preservation of all manner of items from the railways of N.S.W., as well as the GLENREAGH to DORRIGO BRANCH railway line. The collection in the Museum's care, currently 66 Locomotives, 280 Carriages and Wagons, 19 Railmotors/Trailers, a Silver City Comet set and thousands of smaller items is **the largest in the World.** We continually add significant items to the collection. All exhibits are standard gauge (4'8 1/2") and operated on private or Government railways, within New South Wales.

The 36 STEAM Locomotives range from a 27 ton, 4-wheel saddle tank, to the 260 ton, 32-wheel BEYER GARRATT type (the largest locomotives in the Southern Hemisphere); 26 Diesel and 4 Electric Locomotives are also preserved. Passenger rolling stock includes sleeping carriages, 1st and 2nd Class sitting carriages, prison van, travelling Post Offices, "dog boxes", rail pay buses, the former Premier's car, the car allotted for use by General Douglas MacArthur, bulk mail vans, horse boxes and buffet cars. The Museum also supports the largest collection of freight rolling stock preserved in the World. The freight rolling stock covers the haulage of almost every commodity, including coal, grain, livestock, bitumen, oil, cement, biscuits, fruit, water, limestone, tar, meat, milk, superphosphate, explosives, molten metal, Army Tanks, LPG, containers, coiled steel, ore, electricity transformers, machinery and automobiles. A very large display of locomotives, rolling stock and thousands of smaller items, is being established on 53 acres of land owned by the Museum at DORRIGO and will eventually all be placed under cover. We are not yet allowed to open to the public. The Museum owns 35 kilometres of the Dorrigo Branch Line; Steam locomotive hauled tourist trains will operate from DORRIGO to 2 points on the picturesque line and return, giving a choice of trips.

All work in the Museum is done by volunteer labour to keep costs down, although some paid labour will be possible later. Our Members have outlaid over 7 MILLION DOLLARS out of their own pockets, to save the collection from scrap; however, finance is always in short supply to transport, weatherproof, house and restore the irreplaceable exhibits, purchase the land, level the site and lay new sidings.
